When his father is arrested as a debtor in 1849 London, fourteen-year-old John Huffman must take on unexpected responsibilities, from asking a distant relative for help to determining why people are spying on him and his family.

Hill by Megan Frazer Blakemore



Under the Egg by Laura Marx *Fitzgerald*

Her grandfather's dying words lead thirteenyear-old Theodora Tenpenny to a valuable, hidden painting she fears may be stolen, but it is her search for answers in her Greenwich Village neighborhood that brings a real treasure.

The Midnight Tunnel by Angie Frazier

In 1905, Suzanna is in training to be a wellmannered hostess at a Loch Harbor, New Brunswick, hotel, but her dream of being a detective gets a boost when a seven-year-old guest goes missing and Suzanna's uncle, a famous detective, comes to solve the case.

Gingersnap by Patricia Reilly Giff

The Inquisitor's Apprentice




The Pharaoh's Secret by Ma-
